Our readings this week

Acts 2 14a, 22-32 The message of the church is that Jesus is the man attested to by God and through whom God worked. God allowed him to be crucified, but despite the worst that humanity could do to him, God raised him to life, vindicating him before the world and enthroning him as David's successor. To this the disciples are witnesses.

Psalms 16 The psalmist sees that those who put their faith in God's care and guidance are assured of a truly delightful inheritance. Both Peter and Paul saw that Jesus, whose resurrection fulfills verse 10 more completely than the psalmist could have imagined, gave a still greater depth of meaning to this lovely psalm.

1 Peter 1 3-9 The significance of the resurrection surpasses even what it has done for Christ, for it transforms our situation, too. It gives us new birth, from which flows a stream of good things. In faith we lay hold on God's power to protect us. We become heirs of an inheritance to come which, unlike human wealth, will endure. Our faith enables us to live in great joy, even if we have to endure suffering. Our new situation is one of hope, as we lay hold of the full measure of the salvation Christ has won for us.

John 20 19-31 At their meeting on the first day of the week, the disciples found Jesus in their midst. It was there that they experienced his gift of the Holy Spirit. Those who believe without directly witnessing the risen Jesus are promised even greater blessing than first disciples. When we meet as his church, we repeat their experience. Any time we are not present, we risk missing the peace and joy of an encounter with Jesus.

Pointers for prayer

- The Easter message is powerful. Pray that the church will experience God's help as we speak of what God has done for us;
- Will I recognize Jesus, when I meet him in the midst of his community?
- By trusting him to guide us, we are promised a delightful inheritance;
- Pray for those who, running after other gods, find their sorrows increasing.
